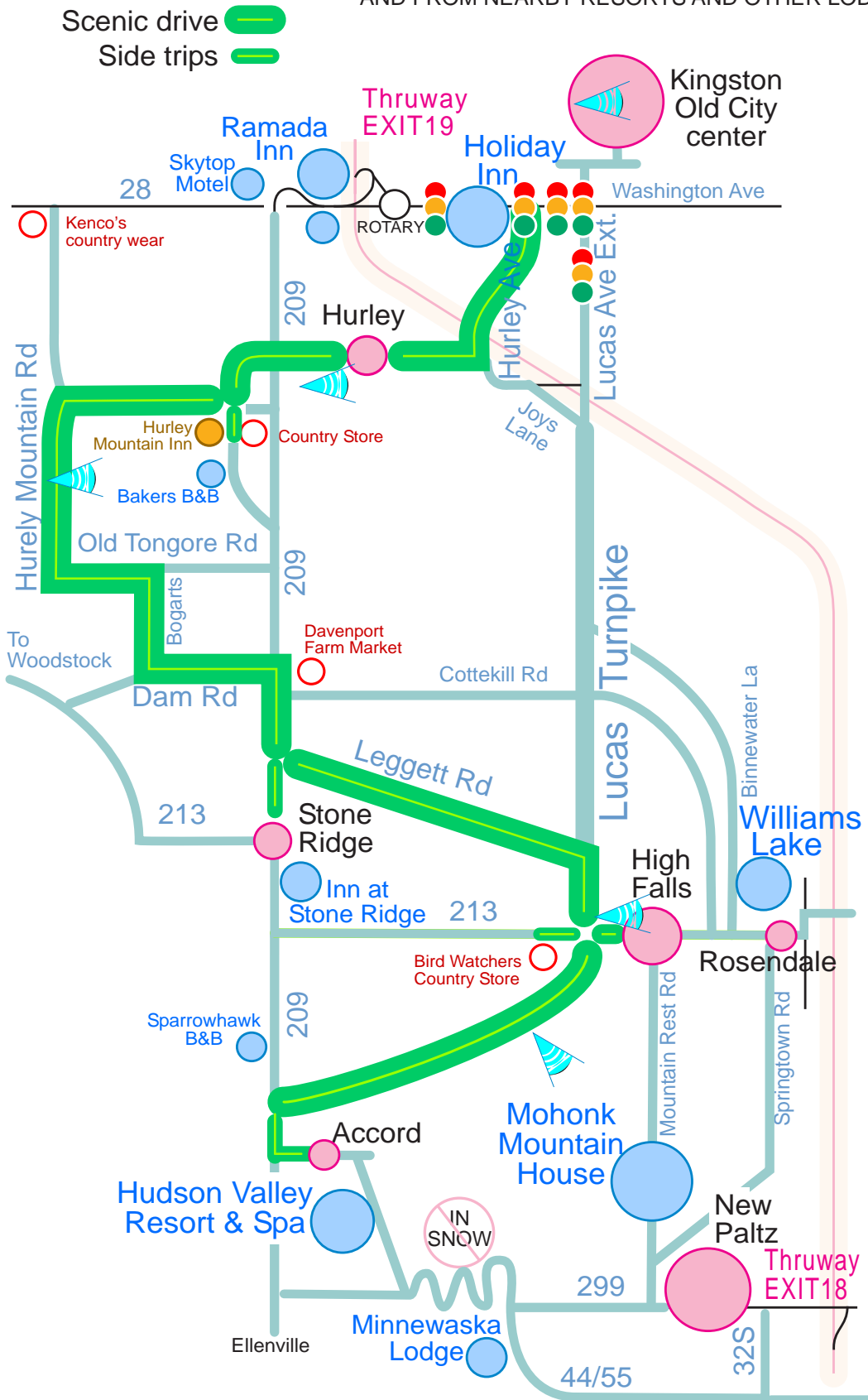


# nycgetaways Lucas Turnpike

GREAT SCENIC DRIVE IN THE HEART OF OLD FARMING COUNTRY.

HOW TO GET TO IT FROM THRUWAY EXITS 18 & 19

AND FROM NEARBY RESORTS AND OTHER LODGINGS



## Lucas Turnpike

One of the region's most historic roads. Originally built to be a turnpike, it was not economic, and went public.

The route we suggest here takes in the more country southern end, plus a string of varied country lanes to the north.

Go slow, and there's a leisurely country day here. Shop in High Falls, visit potteries in Accord, lunch where Tootsie was shot (Hurley Mountain Inn), stroll the amazing main street of Hurley, and take in the historic (1652) old city of Kingston.

## Route 209

An old Indian trail. Originally the trail ran from Kingston through Hurley, then headed south. Early on, it became known as Old Mine Trail, for the steady stream of miners seeking gold further west.

It was taken over for a railroad (notice "Depot Street" in Hurley), and when that closed in the '30s, it became a busy highway.

## Scenic roads

Blue and green roads are scenic.

## Towns

Size of red disks for towns suggests restaurant and shopping possibilities. Visit High Falls for restaurants and antiques. And charm.

## Lodgings

Size of blue disks for resorts suggests relative number of rooms.

## Restaurants/Country stores

Unusual eating spots and stores outside the towns, worth stopping at.
